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REPORT SUMMARY (2022-23)

Blood Donation and Thalassemia Awareness Camp

REPORT

Blood donation camps are instrumental in addressing blood shortages, promoting social responsibility, and enhancing community relations. These events not only benefit public health but also play a crucial role in the personal development of the cadets. The NSS unit of Kidderpore College organized a Blood Donation Camp and Thalassemia Awareness event in collaboration with the Blood Bank of R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital and SSKM Hospital on May 13, 2023. Encouraging sufficient donor participation is crucial for the success of the camp. In conducting the camp, our institution accepted challenges of dispelling myths or fears about blood donation, addressing eligibility criteria, and creating awareness about the importance of regular blood donation. Members of the Students' Health Home, Kolkata Regional Centre, also attended the program. The camp ran from 11 a.m. to approximately 4 p.m. and was a great success, with 60 participants including students and local residents.

NSS and NCC Rally Awareness on World Health Day

REPORT

The NSS Unit of Kidderpore College participated in a rally on World Health Day, organized by the Students' Health Home, Kolkata Regional Centre, on April 7, 2023. The rally began at 9 a.m. at Esplanade Metro Channel and concluded at Ramleela Maidan, Moulali. Fifty students, including NSS members, along with several teachers and office staff, represented our college in this large event, which saw nearly two thousand students from various educational institutions across Kolkata join.

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Combined Annual Training Camp -XIII

REPORT

The camp began with the Hon'ble Principal of Kidderpore College and IQAC Coordinator, Dr. Swati Pal, presenting token gifts to Dr. Das and his assistant. A total of 52 individuals, including teachers, students, non-teaching staff, and local community members, attended the program and received eye check-ups.

Combined Annual Training Camp -XI

Combined Annual Training Camp [CAT-KC-VIII (Phase -II)]


REPORT

REPORT



Combined Annual Training Camp (CAT -KC -1)


REPORT

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Sensitisation-cum-Awareness Programme on Vector-Borne Diseases Particularly Dengue and Malaria in the Covid 19 Pandemic Regime


REPORT

Students from both the Arts and Commerce streams enthusiastically participated in the event. Dr. Pradip Mukherjee from Anand Mohon College and Mr. Ujjwal Dey from the Health Home were the resource persons. Dr. Mukherjee gave an extensive lecture on protecting oneself from life-threatening mosquito-borne diseases, particularly dengue and malaria. He also provided useful tips on avoiding cold, cough, and flu during the winter season. Mr. Dey offered valuable advice on spreading awareness about Thalassemia and committed to organizing a program and special camp on the issue. Forty two (42) NCC students of our college actively engaged in the program. In addition, Women and children from the local slum area also attended the program, sharing their problems with Dr. Mukherjee, who provided appropriate solutions.

Plant Donation Program

SSB Camp


REPORT

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7-days Special Camp


REPORT


REPORT

Combined Annual Training Camp


REPORT

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
