## FEEDBACK REPORT (2021-22)

The academic year 2021-22 featured a blend of online and offline education modes. Towards the conclusion of this period, physical copies of feedback forms were distributed to students across all disciplines through their respective departments and the college's administrative office. Once filled out, these feedback forms were returned to the committee members tasked with their collection. Our college's Internal Quality Assurance cell, with assistance from faculty members of the Teacher's Council, analyzed the received feedback responses and produced the ensuing reports:

Analysis: A comprehensive questionnaire was developed to gather students' feedback, comprising 10 questions covering various areas such as timely syllabus completion, teacher support, availability of scholarship grants, and challenges encountered in online classes. Respondents were instructed to rate each question on a numerical scale from 1 to 5, where 5 indicated Strongly Agreed, 4 denoted Agreed, 3 represented No Comments, 2 indicated Disagreed, and 1 stood for Strongly Disagreed. Each question was scored using the arithmetic mean average method. The analysis indicated that students expressed high satisfaction levels with teacher assistance and interactive classroom teaching.



### Analysis:

The main focus on the teachers feedback has been given on the several challenges faced by them during online teaching-learning and level of participations of the students in online mode of education during almost last two years. Each question is scored with the same methodology explained earlier. In spite of good number of students attended the online classes, the teachers were dissatisfied in many areas of online teaching-learning particularly online evaluation process and time offered to complete the whole syllabus of CBCS which are supposed to be reduced in pandemic period.

### **Action Taken Report**

An analytical report derived from feedback received from both students and teachers has been compiled and disseminated to the Teacher's Council via the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). Following discussions with the Teacher's Council, IQAC members pinpointed areas of discontent and institutional shortcomings that necessitate improvement. Given the blended teaching mode in this academic session, addressing these deficiencies initially posed challenges. Nevertheless, several initiatives were undertaken, such as introducing skill development programs, establishing a language laboratory to enhance students' communication skills, and organizing digital literacy programmes.

### FEEDBACK REPORT (2022-23)

During the 2022-23 academic session, Kidderpore College utilized an online platform to gather feedbackfrom various stakeholders. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) created Google Forms tailored for different stakeholders, encompassing a comprehensive questionnaire covering aspects such as social and contemporary relevance of the curriculum, infrastructure quality, and the effectiveness of the teaching-learning process. These Google Forms were then distributed to Departmental Heads for dissemination within existing student WhatsApp groups across various disciplines, as well as among alumni and employers. Subsequently, the collected responses underwent analysis, leading to the creation of Feedback Reports.

Analysis: Students represent the primary and most influential stakeholders within the institution. The feedback questionnaire comprises 15 questions aimed at gauging their satisfaction levels regarding the curriculum, learning methodologies, and assessment processes experienced during this academic session. Each question is rated on a numerical scale from 1 to 5, where 5 signifies "Excellent," 4 indicates "Very Good," 3 denotes "Good," 2 represents "Average," and 1 corresponds to "Poor." The responses are then aggregated using the Arithmetic Mean formula. The results indicate that students are highly content with the communication during teaching sessions. However, there is need for improvement, particularly concerning the availability of teaching and learning resources such as the library, ICT facilities, and

laboratories. The feedback obtained could inform syllabus revisions, curriculum restructuring, andenhancements to program quality.

Analysis: Teachers represent the primary stakeholders of the institutions. They generally concur that the course curriculum adequately addresses the life skills and human values of the students. Each question intheir feedback is rated on a numerical scale from 1 to 5, with 5 indicating "Strongly Agreed," 4 for "Agreed," 3 for "No Comments," 2 for "Disagreed," and 1 for "Strongly Disagreed." The scores are then calculated using the Arithmetic Mean. The findings indicate that faculty members are highly content with the active participation of students in extracurricular activities. However, many teachers express dissatisfaction with the distribution of the syllabus within the constraints of the limited

timeframe in the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) semester structure.

**Analysis:** Employers are required to respond to dichotomous questions in the questionnaire, where "Yes" corresponds to 5 and "No" equals 0. The findings indicate that employers of the college's graduates are highly content with their adaptability to new work environments and their discipline. However, they express relatively less satisfaction with their employees' soft skills, which could have been developed through the undergraduate course curriculum.

#### **Action Taken Report**

An analytical report based on feedback responses from various stakeholders is prepared and distributed to the Teacher's Council through the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). Following consultations with the Teacher's Council, the IQAC members identified areas of dissatisfaction and shortcomings within the institution that require improvement.

Our

institution has decided to commence developmental work on the laboratories of several departments and enhance the library infrastructure starting from the upcoming academic session. Additionally, the building committee is concentrating on improving infrastructural facilities by expanding the building



areato address various issues highlighted in the feedback responses.
